FAQs

What is the NHG Community Culture Fund?

*The NHG Community Culture Fund is a fund set up by the Notting Hill Genesis (NHG) Resident Involvement and Engagement Team, and is dedicated to celebrating and embracing Diversity, Equality, and Inclusion within local NHG communities, led by and for residents in their local areas.

How much money can be awarded through the Community Culture Fund?

*All NHG residents will have the opportunity to apply to the NHG Community Culture Fund every quarter (roughly every 3 months). Residents will be able to apply for a maximum of £250. If all successful applicants have applied for the full £250, then a maximum of 4 applications will be approved. (Total of £1000 available every quarter.)

*If successful applications require less funding than the maximum £250, then where possible, more than 4 applicants will be awarded the grant.

*Where there is a shortfall of applications, or there is money left over from the quarter, this money will roll over to the next application window, where more residents will then have the opportunity to be awarded money from the fund.

*Applications made during the opening window for the same month of the opening window will not be accepted.

*Applications without clear links for the items will not be accepted.

How can I apply for the Community Culture Fund?

*To apply for funding from the Community Culture Fund, you must complete and submit an application form and send it to involvement@nhg.org.uk before the deadline date.

How will the successful applicants be selected?

*Once all application forms for the relevant quarter have been received, they will be anonymised by a member of the Resident Engagement Team. Then, the anonymised applications will go to a panel, comprised of staff and residents for deliberation and a decision.

*Once the panel has selected its winners, the relevant residents will be contacted about their successful selection to be recipient of the funding.

Terms and Conditions

Grants will only be awarded if:

- *An NHG resident/s have applied for it.
- *The project or event celebrates diversity within the residents' local community.

Grant applications will be considered if they meet the following purposes:

- *Celebrating diversity in the community.
- *Inclusive activities within the community.
- *Activities and events to bring communities together and embrace people of different backgrounds and heritages.

Grant applications will not be considered if they fall under the following:

- *Funding for individual residents, with no wider impact or benefit for the wider community.

*Funding for repairs, service charge payments or other financial payments to NHG or any other organisations (specifically related to housing or maintenance costs).

*Projects that are specific to one community and exclude others.

*Events that could potentially be harmful or damaging, whether mentally, emotionally, or physically to different communities.
